



Before you detail the stove, confirm the fuel, the occupancy, and whether the IMC even governs.

Original Masterbuild PE packet from Daily Code Talk #167. 2024 IMC 901.1–901.4. Confirm the adopted edition. Gas-fired appliances are International Fuel Gas Code. Fireplaces and solid-fuel appliances are prohibited in hazardous locations and in Group I-2, Condition 2.

☐ **901.1: Chapter 9 is the appliances identified in the chapter, including factory-built fireplaces.**

An appliance appearing in Chapter 9 does not automatically make the IMC the complete design path.

☐ **901.2: Chapter 9 applies in addition to the other applicable IMC requirements.**

A Chapter 9 section is one layer. 303 location, 304 installation, Chapter 8 venting, and listing still apply.

☐ **901.3 / 901.4: solid-fuel and fireplaces out of hazardous locations and out of Group I-2, Condition 2.**

Do not specify the insert and then discover the occupancy.

The hold we see first

Gas fireplace specified on the mechanical schedule with only an IMC 903 note. IFGC never opened. Occupancy is I-2. Two codes, one stove, no path.

What to send: appliance type, fuel, occupancy, and whether the location is classified.

Send the comments. Not the County guideline.

Folio (does it start with 30?), process or UP number, and the comments PDF. Masterbuild will say which row is actually open.
